

2011 Alaska Rifle Club Long Range Regional Tournament

Dates: July 23/24, 2011

Location: Colorado Range, Ft. Greely, Alaska

Directions: Traveling South on the Richardson Highway from Delta Junction, you cross a small bridge as you leave Delta Junction and enter Ft. Greely, then you turn on the next road on your right (West side of highway). There will be a sign placed there.

Traveling North on the Richardson Highway you will pass the main gate to Ft. Greely on your right (East side of highway), and you turn on the next road on your left (West side of highway). There will be a sign placed there. Follow the signs to Colorado Range. Note: See map at the bottom of program.

Rules: Current NRA rules will govern. Open Bolt Indicator, Hearing and Eye Protection are required!

Capacity: Maximum competitors: 32

Eligibility: Open to any ARC member. One or 2 day memberships (\$5.00) are available for non-member competitors (for liability insurance coverage).

Fees: 2 Day Tournament Fee: \$25. (Includes NRA fee of \$9.00. Shooters under 18 are free)

Entries Due: 09:00 AM – 9:30 AM

Start Times: 10:00 AM

Squadding: Squadding assignment for individual matches will be issued during registration.

Classification: The NRA LR classification system will be used. Unclassified competitors will compete in the Master Class. Assigned Classification (Rule 19.6), or Temporary Classification (Rule 19.2), may be used. F-Class will use their LR classifications.

Targets: 1000 yard LR target, and 1000 yard F-Class LR Target. Competitors will be required to pull targets for other competitors.

Rifles: NRA Match Rifle (Rule 3.3), Service Rifle (Rule 3.1, 3.1.1, 3.1(d) or 3.1.2), Any Rifle/any sight (Rule 3.2) or Palma Rifle (Rule 3.3.3). Also F-Class (Open and TR).

Sat. July 23, 2011

Match A: unlimited sighting shots and 20 shots for record in 30 minutes prone slow fire at 800 yards LR target.

Match B: unlimited sighting shots and 20 shots for record in 30 minutes prone slow fire at 900 yards LR target.

Match C: unlimited sighting shots and 20 shots for record in 30 minutes prone slow fire at 1000 yards LR target.

Match D: Will consist of an aggregate of the three matches above.

Note: F-Class will fire the same course as LRHP, with F-Class targets. Each group only competes with others in their group.

Awards: (Open Awards, Match D)

Class and Category Awards:

There must be 5 or more entries in a class for one award, 8 or more for two awards; and 13 or more for three awards. If there are fewer than 5 High Masters entered, they must fire for open awards only. The High Master Class may not be combined with the Master Class. If there are fewer than the required number of entries in a class to provide awards, they will be combined with the same class in another category. If there are still fewer than 5 entries after combining all categories of a class, there will be no awards provided in that class, and all competitors in the lower class will be moved back to their respective category within the next higher class until there is a minimum of 5 competitors in the combined class.

Sun. July 24, 2011

Match A: unlimited sighting shots and 20 shots for record in 30 minutes prone slow fire at 1000 yards LR target.

Match B: unlimited sighting shots and 20 shots for record in 30 minutes prone slow fire at 1000 yards LR target.

Match C: unlimited sighting shots and 20 shots for record in 30 minutes prone slow fire at 1000 yards LR target.

Match D: Will consist of an aggregate of the three matches above.

Note 1: F-Class will fire the same course as LRHP, with F-Class targets. Each group only competes with others in their group.

Note 2: The above matches on **7/24/ 2014** may be fired with 1 rifle for each match, or a different rifle for each match. Rifle can not be changed during an individual match except per the rules of a disabled rifle (9.1).

Awards: (Open Awards, Match D)

Class and Category Awards:

There must be 5 or more entries in a class for one award, 8 or more for two awards; and 13 or more for three awards. If there are fewer than 5 High Masters entered, they must fire for open awards only. The High Master Class may not be combined with the Master Class. If there are fewer than the required number of entries in a class to provide awards, they will be combined with the same class in another category. If there are still fewer than 5 entries after combining all categories of a class, there will be no awards provided in that class, and all competitors in the lower class will be moved back to their respective category within the next higher class until there is a minimum of 5 competitors in the combined class.
