100 Yard Reduced High Power Approved Tournaments

- Dates:** June 29, July 28, and September 14, 2019
- Location:** Matanuska Valley Sportsman's Shooting Range
- Directions:** Traveling North from Anchorage, follow the Glenn Highway towards Palmer. The range is at mile 38.5 of the Glenn Highway. A hill will hide the range until you are almost there. Watch for a small sign for the range about 3.5 mi from the split of the Parks and Glenn and 75 yd from the driveway. The range is on the west side of the road. You will see cones by the driveway before you see the building. The state fair grounds are about 1.5 mi north of the range.

- Rules:** Current NRA High Power rules will govern. Open Bolt Indicator, Hearing and Eye Protection are required!
- Eligibility:** Open to any ARC member. One-day memberships (\$5.00) are available for out of town competitors.
- Capacity:** Maximum competitors: 18 Minimum competitors: 2
- Fees:** Tournament Fee: \$15. (NRA fee of \$4.50 is included. Competitor must pay MVS range fee of \$10 or punch card for MVS members. \$20 for non-members. Shooters under 18 are free but must pay MVS.)
- Entries Due:** Range opens 9:00 AM. Entries close at 9:30. **Online registration at www.akrifleclub.com** is preferred. Walk on competitors will be squadded in a first come first served basis.
- Start Times:** Shooting will start at 10:00 AM
- Squadding:** Squadding assignment will be issued during registration.
- Classification** The NRA classification system will be used. Unclassified competitors will compete in the Master Class. Assigned Classification (Rule 19.6), or Temporary Classification (Rule 19.2), may be used.
- Targets:** 100 yd reduced Targets, SR-1, SR-21, and MR-31. Competitors will be required to score targets for other competitors.
- Sighters:** Sighting shots (Rule 9.2.1), which are allowed in the conditions for each match may be taken and recorded. Sighting shots may be taken in a position other than specified for the match but must be one of those described in Rule 5 of the High Power Rifle Rule Book, except 5.13.
- Rifles:** **NRA Service Rifle-Rule 3.1(a,b,c,d)**
- Optical Sights: The rifle may have an optical sight (reflective sights are considered optical sights) with a maximum power of 4.5X. Variable scopes with a maximum of 4.5X are permitted. Only commercially manufactured scopes that were produced with a maximum magnification of 4.5X and that have a maximum objective lens of 34mm may be used. If an optical sight is used, the same optical sight must be used in all stages of a course of fire (changing sights is not permitted). The centerline of an optical sight shall be no higher than 3.5 inches above the centerline of the bore.
- Metallic sights: The rifle may be equipped with issue-type metallic front and rear sights. The front and rear sights must be standard issue or National Match design but may vary in dimensions or rear sight aperture and front sight blade. The rear sight aperture may be hooded.
- NRA Match Rifle-Rule 3.3**
- Match 1:** 2 sighting shots and 10 shots for record, standing, slow fire, 100 yards, SR-1 target.
- Match 2:** 2 sighting shots and 10 shots for record, sitting or kneeling, rapid fire, 100 yards, SR-1 target.
- Match 3:** 2 sighting shots and 10 shots for record, prone, rapid fire, SR-21 target.
- Match 4:** 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record, prone, slow fire, MR-31 target.
- Match 5:** The slow fire aggregate: an aggregate of scores fired in matches 1 and 4
- Match 6:** The rapid-fire aggregate: an aggregate of scores fired in matches 2 and 3
- Match 7:** Aggregate of scores from matches 1-4
- Classes:** In fired match will be the same as aggregate matches.
- Awards:** Open Awards: First, Second, etc. based on Match 7

Note 1: No monetary awards unless there is at least 6 competitors.

Note 2: Monetary awards will be mailed at the end of the season.

Class and Category Awards:

There must be 5 or more entries in a class for one award, 8 or more for two awards; and 13 or more for three awards. If there are fewer than 5 High Masters entered, they must fire for open awards only. The High Master Class may not be combined with the Master Class. If there are fewer than the required number of entries in a class to provide awards, they will be combined with the same class in another category. If there are still fewer than 5 entries after combining all categories of a class, there will be **no awards** provided in that class, and all competitors in the lower class will be moved back to their respective category within the next higher class until there is a minimum of 5 competitors in the combined class.
