Rules: Current NRA High Power rules will govern.

Eligibility: Open to any ARC member. One or 2 day memberships (\$5.00) are available for out of town competitors.

Registration Capacity and Fees:

Mid-Range Prone/ F-Class \$30 for both days or \$20 for one day (\$9.00 to NRA - Shooters under 18 are free)

Regional Mid-Range Prone/F-Class: 300, 500, 600 yards: 0930, Saturday

Regional Mid-Range Prone/F-Class: 3 times at 600 yards: 0930, Sunday

Squadding: All matches will be squadded. Squadding for individual matches will be issued during registration. **NRA Membership numbers and classification cards must be exhibited, if a competitor has them, before squadding tickets will be issued.** A competitor who fails to present himself at the proper firing point when his relay is called may lose his right to compete in that event.

Classification: The NRA classification system will be used in all matches. Unclassified competitors will compete in the Master Class. Assigned Classification (Rule 19.6), or Temporary Classification (Rule 19.2), may be used when making an entry in an NRA Mid-Range Prone Regional match. The F-Class is a separate classification in the Mid-Range Prone Regional match.

Targets: Unless noted elsewhere, 300 yard MR-63, 500 yard MR-65, 600 yard MR-1 targets for the Mid Range Prone, and the F-Class 300, 500 and 600 yard targets for F-Class competitors in the Mid Range. Competitors will be required to pull targets.

Note: There is a new NRA rule, that there must be at least 8 competitors to have a Regional, and give a gold medal, 10 to give a Silver medal and 15 to give a Bronze medal. Beside this, they will give a first place Classification medal for each class with a minimum of 5 competitors. The Prone and F-Class are 2 different Regional's, so this rule applies to each group separately for the medals.

- Classification** The NRA classification system will be used. Unclassified competitors will compete in the Master Class. Assigned Classification (Rule 19.6), or Temporary Classification (Rule 19.2), may be used.
- Targets:** 300 yard MR-63, 500 yard MR-65, 600 yard MR-1 target. Competitors will be required to pull targets for other competitors.
- Rifles:** NRA Match Rifle (Rule 3.3), Service Rifle (Rule 3.1(a), 3.1(b), 3.1(c), 3.1(d)). Any Rifle/any sight (Rule 3.2) or Palma Rifle (Rule 3.3.3). **OR** F-Class Open Rifle (F-0) (Rule 3.4(a)), F-Class Target Rifle (F-TR) (Rule 3.4(b)).
- Match A:** Two sighting shots and 20 shots for record in 22 minutes prone slow fire at 300 yards MR-63 target.
Match B: Two sighting shots and 20 shots for record in 22 minutes prone slow fire at 500 yards MR-65 target.
Match C: Two sighting shots and 20 shots for record in 22 minutes prone slow fire at 600 yards MR-1 target.
Match D: Will consist of an aggregate of the three matches above.
- Classes:** NRA Mid-Range Prone Classifications will apply. Classifications in the aggregate match (D) will be the same as the fired matches.
- F-Class** F-Class shooters will fire the same course as the HP Mid-Range Prone shooters, only they will use the F-Class targets at each distance and will fire either F-TR or F-Open with a Mid-Range classification against other F-Class shooters only, and Rule 22 - F-CLASS RIFLE RULES will apply.
- Awards:** (Open Awards, Match D)

Class and Category Awards:

There must be 5 or more entries in a class for one award, 8 or more for two awards; and 13 or more for three awards. If there are fewer than 5 High Masters entered, they must fire for open awards only. The High Master Class may not be combined with the Master Class. If there are fewer than the required number of entries in a class to provide awards, they will be combined with the same class in another category. If there are still fewer than 5 entries after combining all categories of a class, there will be **no awards** provided in that class, and all competitors in the lower class will be moved back to their respective category within the next higher class until there is a minimum of 5 competitors in the combined class.

- Match E:** Two sighting shots and 20 shots for record in 22 minutes prone slow fire at 600 yards MR-1 target.
- Match F:** Two sighting shots and 20 shots for record in 22 minutes prone slow fire at 600 yards MR-1 target.
- Match G:** Two sighting shots and 20 shots for record in 22 minutes prone slow fire at 600 yards MR-1 target.
- Match H:** Will consist of an aggregate of the three matches above.
- Match I:** Will consist of an aggregate of Match D and Match H, for the Alaska Mid-Range Championship. Must have fired both days to win this Match.
- Classes:** NRA Mid-Range Prone Classifications will apply. Classifications in the aggregate match's H and I will be the same as the fired matches.
- F-Class** F-Class shooters will fire the same course as the HP Mid-Range Prone shooters, only they will use the F-Class targets at each distance and will fire either F-TR or F-Open with a Mid-Range classification against other F-Class shooters only, and Rule 22 - F-CLASS RIFLE RULES will apply.
- Awards:** (Open Awards, Match H and Match I)

Class and Category Awards:

There must be 5 or more entries in a class for one award, 8 or more for two awards; and 13 or more for three awards. If there are fewer than 5 High Masters entered, they must fire for open awards only. The High Master Class may not be combined with the Master Class. If there are fewer than the required number of entries in a class to provide awards, they will be combined with the same class in another category. If there are still fewer than 5 entries after combining all categories of a class, there will be **no awards** provided in that class, and all competitors in the lower class will be moved back to their respective category within the next higher class until there is a minimum of 5 competitors in the combined class.
